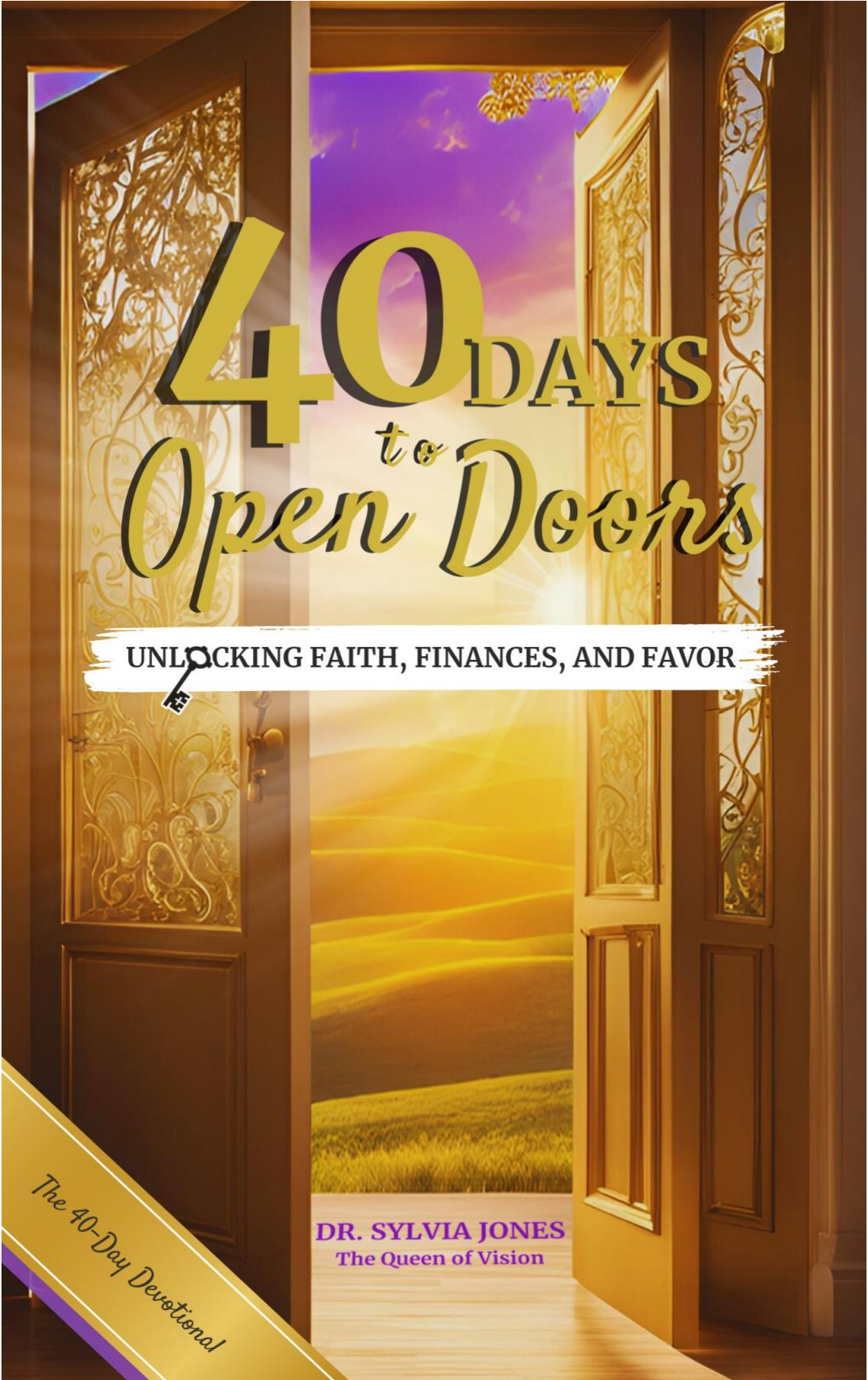

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Introduction

40 Days to Open Doors: Unlocking Faith, Finances, and Favor

Hello, Beautiful Child of God,

I'm Dr. Sylvia Jones, a wife, a mother, and an optometrist by trade, but most importantly, a servant of the Most High. If you had told me a few months ago that I would be writing this devotional or leading 40 days of prayer, I might have laughed nervously and said, "I don't have time." But God has a way of interrupting our plans with His purpose, and let me tell you, when He calls, you answer.

Let me share the story of how this journey began.

A few months ago, I attended a women's prayer breakfast. I went there expecting a peaceful morning of worship and fellowship. Little did I know, God had something far greater planned. This prayer breakfast was unlike anything I had ever experienced. Women were praying with fervor, tears streaming down their faces, and faith filling the room.

During the event, the First Lady of the hosting church introduced me, "This is Dr. Jones, the eye doctor!" I smiled, waved politely, and settled back into my seat, ready to quietly soak in the moment. Shortly after, a powerful woman of God stood up, pointed at me, and said, "Dr. Jones, go to the back of the room and open the door."

Confused but obedient, I got up, walked to the back, and opened the door. At first, no one moved. Then, one by one, women began to rise and walk through that door. As I stood there watching, I felt a stirring in my spirit. What was God trying to tell me?

Later in the program, this same woman of God asked me to stand behind her as she prayed over others. After she prayed for everyone else in the room, the First Lady asked her "Are you going to pray for Dr. Jones? She turned and declared, "Dr. Jones will be the one to open the door, I want her to pray for me." At that moment, I was shocked, but I felt qualified, prepared, and sure so I proceeded to pray and prophecy over her. I felt God telling me to pay attention.

Over the next few months, I found myself in prayer, asking, What does 'open the door' mean, Lord? What are You asking me to do? Life got busy, and I pushed the thought aside—until another woman of God prayed over me at my church and repeated, "Open the door." This wasn't a coincidence; it was confirmation.

I dove into Scripture, seeking clarity. The verse that struck me was Matthew 7:7: "Knock, and the door will be opened to you." The key, God revealed, was prayer. Not just for me, but for all of us. God told me to venture out into 40 Days of prayer with my family that ended up changing our lives.

So here I am, writing this devotional and inviting you to join me in 40 days of prayer—praying for open doors in faith, finances, and favor. Each day is designed to help you grow closer to God, unlock areas of your life that feel stuck, and step boldly into your purpose.

This devotional isn't just about my journey—it's about yours too. I believe that as you commit to these 40 days, God will meet you right where you are. He will reveal things you've been praying for, open doors you never thought possible, and strengthen your faith in ways that will leave you in awe.

We're living in a time when prayer is not just important; it's essential. The challenges in our world are great, but so is our God. Together, let's seek Him with boldness, trust Him with our hearts, and believe that He is still in the business of miracles.

Day 1: The Year of the Open Door

Scripture:

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." — Matthew 7:7

Reflection:

Today marks the beginning of a transformative 40-day journey—an invitation to step into the Year of the Open Door. In this season, God is calling His people to move boldly, to pray with purpose, and to embrace the doors He is opening before us.

The “open door” is more than an opportunity; it’s an assignment. As I stood in obedience to God’s instruction to “open the door,” I realized it wasn’t just for me—it was for others to walk through as well. God is doing something *new*, and He’s calling you to be a part of it.

Sometimes, God calls us to step into unfamiliar places, to break through fear, and to use what we already have—our voice, our platforms, and our prayers—to bring revival, restoration, and freedom to those around us. Prayer:

Lord, let this time of prayer unlock new doors of favor, healing, and breakthrough in my life and the lives of others. I surrender my fears and ask for Your guidance as I walk in faith. In Jesus’ name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. What “new thing” is God calling you to step into this season?
 2. Are there fears or barriers holding you back from stepping through God’s open door?
 3. How can you use your gifts, platforms, or influence to serve God’s purpose right now?
 4. Who can you pray for or encourage to walk through their own “open door”?
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Action Step:

Spend time in prayer today, asking God to reveal the doors He is opening for you. Write down one step of faith you will take this week to move forward in obedience.

Let today be the first of many steps through doors that lead to favor, freedom, and divine opportunity. **The door is open—will you walk through it?**

Day 2: Prayer for the Economy and Dominion

Scripture:

"And God blessed them. And God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth.'" — Genesis 1:28

Reflection:

Today, as we continue our journey of 40 days of prayer, we turn our focus to the economy and our God-given authority to take dominion over the earth. In these uncertain times—inflation, supply chain disruptions, financial hardship, and economic shifts—it can feel like we are powerless. But God reminds us in Genesis that we have been given *dominion*. As His people, we are called to walk in authority, pray with confidence, and believe that God can move even in the most difficult circumstances.

Prayer:

I declare Your authority over my life, finances, and future. Help me to walk boldly in faith, knowing You are my source and my sustainer. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. What economic or financial concerns do you need to surrender to God in prayer?
2. Are you walking in the authority and dominion God has given you? If not, what is holding you back?

3. How can you pray specifically for your local economy, businesses, and community today?
 4. What practical steps can you take to align your finances and decisions with God's wisdom?
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Action Step:

Spend time today praying for economic stability, not just in your life but in your community, country, and beyond. Write down one area where you need to take authority and trust God's provision—whether it's in your finances, career, or business.

Remember: Prayer is the key to opening the doors God has prepared for you. Walk boldly, knowing He is in control. **The door to dominion is yours to open.**

Day 3: Praying for the World

Scripture:

"If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." — 2 Chronicles 7:14

Reflection:

Today's focus reminds us of our responsibility to intercede for our nation, the world, and those in need. As believers, we cannot ignore the turmoil happening in our own countries and regions like the Middle East. These moments—whether natural disasters, political instability, or conflicts—are reminders of our call to stand in the gap through prayer.

We are living in uncertain and often tumultuous times. Attacks, hurricanes, fires, economic disruptions, and racial tensions threaten peace and stability. Lord, we also pray for repentance in our nations—that hearts would turn to You and seek Your face in these critical times. Raise up believers to pray boldly and without fear. We trust in Your sovereignty and power. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. What current global or local issue weighs heavily on your heart? Have you taken it to God in prayer?
2. How can you humble yourself and seek God more intentionally during this season?

3. Do you believe your prayers can make a difference in global conflicts and crises? Why or why not?
 4. How can you encourage others in your community to join you in praying for peace and healing?
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Action Step:

Take 10 minutes today to pray specifically for:

- Peace in the Middle East and nations experiencing conflict.
- Healing for those suffering from disasters or loss.
- Unity, repentance, and revival in your own country.

Write down any specific prayers or insights God reveals to you during this time. Remember, your prayers carry the authority to unlock doors of peace, healing, and restoration in this world.

Together, let us stand in the gap. The door to healing is unlocked through prayer.

Day 4: A Call to Prayer for Healing and Unity

Scripture:

"He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." — Psalm 147:3

Reflection:

On this fourth day of our prayer journey, we are reminded of the power of prayer to heal, unite, and strengthen us—especially during life's storms. God is calling us to lift up those who are grieving, struggling, and burdened by the weight of loss, broken marriages, and financial pressures.

In a world full of pain—whether it's families mourning loved ones, strained marriages under attack, or racial and financial divides—we are not helpless. We serve a God who hears our cries and offers healing. When we pray, we invite Him to mend hearts, restore relationships, and provide for every need.

Prayer:

Lord, we also pray for unity in this country and the courage to see each other through Your eyes. Finally, Father, we ask for provision for those struggling financially. Remind us that You are our provider, and Your resources are endless. We trust You, Lord, and we thank You for Your faithfulness. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. Is there someone in your life who is grieving or struggling? How can you lift them up in prayer today?
2. Are there areas in your marriage, family, or friendships that need healing and forgiveness? What steps can you take to invite God's restoration?
3. How can you show more grace to yourself and others when life doesn't go as planned?

4. What prayers can you pray over your community, your country, and the divisions you see around you?
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Action Step:

Take a moment today to pray specifically for someone who is grieving, struggling in their marriage, or dealing with loss. Write their name in your prayer journal and commit to lifting them up for the next week. Additionally, ask God to show you one area in your own life where He is calling you to extend grace—whether to yourself or others.

Remember: Through prayer, God binds up wounds, restores relationships, and brings peace. The door to healing opens when we kneel in faith.

Day 5: Prayer for Health and Healing

Scripture:

"But I will restore you to health and heal your wounds, declares the Lord." — Jeremiah 30:17

Reflection:

Day 5 is a call to pray for healing—physical, emotional, and spiritual. Healing is not just about our bodies; it reaches into our hearts, minds, and souls. God is Jehovah Rapha, our healer, and He has promised restoration and renewal. Whether it's a chronic illness, emotional wounds, mental struggles, or past traumas, God's power to heal remains unchanged.

As believers, we must first ask for healing, trusting that God hears our cries. Sometimes healing comes through miraculous moments, and other times it's a process through medical care, therapy, or Godly counsel. Both are divine interventions. God uses people, knowledge, and resources to bring healing, just as He can speak one word and make the sick well.

In the same way, emotional healing requires us to confront past wounds and trust God's guidance to bring us wholeness. We are not called to live in brokenness, bound by pain or fear. God wants us to live an abundant life—one where healing overflows into our homes, marriages, and minds.

Today, let's boldly ask God for healing and protection, for ourselves and for those we love.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we come before You today, lifting up our need for healing. Lord, You are the great Healer, Jehovah Rapha, and we trust You to restore us to health. We pray for those suffering with physical ailments—cancer, diabetes, arthritis, and chronic pain. Bring comfort, strength, and recovery to their bodies. Lord, we also ask for emotional and mental healing. Heal broken hearts, ease anxious minds, and lift the burden of depression. Show us the root of our wounds, guide us to the right people, and give us courage to seek help where needed. Lord, we pray for caretakers who carry heavy burdens, asking that You provide strength, rest, and resources. Let Your healing power flow through every area of our lives—body, mind, and spirit. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. What areas of your life—physical, emotional, or spiritual—are in need of God's healing touch?
 2. Are there past traumas or wounds you have been avoiding? How can you bring them to God in prayer?
 3. Who in your life needs healing? How can you intercede for them today?
 4. Are you a caretaker or supporting someone in need? How can you ask God for strength and guidance?
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Action Step:

Take a moment to write down specific areas where you or a loved one needs healing. Spend 10-15 minutes praying over each one, inviting God to bring restoration. If you're a caretaker, take time for yourself today—rest, reflect, and allow God to replenish your strength.

Reminder: Healing is a promise from God. Whether it's instant or a process, trust that He is at work, bringing wholeness and peace to your life. **The door to healing opens when we boldly ask in faith.**

Day 6: Financial Breakthroughs and Divine Provision

Scripture:

"And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus." — Philippians 4:19

Reflection:

On Day 6, we turn our focus to finances, a topic that impacts so many areas of our lives—our families, businesses, and even our peace of mind. God desires for us to live free from the chains of financial stress and to experience His provision in every area of our lives.

As believers, we are called to be wise stewards of the resources God has given us. Stewardship begins with prayer and is followed by action. Whether you're praying for debt relief, financial wisdom, or the courage to step into a God-given business idea, today is a day to bring those needs before the Lord.

God is not only our provider but also our source of wisdom. He grants strategies, ideas, and open doors to create wealth (Deuteronomy 8:18). Prayer:

Teach us to be wise stewards of what You've given us, and show us how to multiply and manage it well.

Father, we pray for business owners and entrepreneurs who are trusting You for provision. Pour out Your favor and open doors of opportunity. For those waiting on a vision to be fulfilled, we pray for clarity, strategy, and courage to take the next step.

We declare that we are the head and not the tail, the lender and not the borrower. Replace our anxiety with peace and give us faith to trust in Your promises. Let Your blessings overflow so that we may be a blessing to others. In Jesus' name, Amen.*

Questions for Reflection:

1. What specific financial challenges are you facing today? How can you bring them to God in prayer?

2. Have you taken time to thank God for what He has already provided?
 3. What practical steps can you take this week to move toward financial freedom or stewardship?
 4. Are you trusting God to provide for the vision He has given you?

Action Step:

Spend 15 minutes today creating a “Financial Prayer List.” Write down your specific financial needs, whether it’s debt relief, provision for your business, or financial wisdom. Pray over each one, asking God for guidance and strategy.

Reminder: God’s provision is limitless, and His timing is perfect. Trust Him to meet your needs and to guide you in stewarding the resources He has given you. **Your financial breakthrough begins with prayer and obedience.**

Day 7: Protection and Safety

Scripture:

"The Lord will keep you from all harm—he will watch over your life; the Lord will watch over your coming and going both now and forevermore." — Psalm 121:7-8

Reflection:

Today marks Day 7 of our prayer journey, a time to focus on God's promise of protection and safety. In a world where uncertainty seems to grow daily, it is comforting to know that God is our refuge, our shield, and our defender. Whether we face hurricanes, personal trials, or the unseen dangers of daily life, God's hand of protection covers us.

God's protection is not limited to physical safety—it includes guarding our hearts, minds, and spirits from harm. He is the God who sees our struggles, hears our cries, and provides a safe place of refuge. As you pray today, invite His presence into your life and the lives of your loved ones. Prayer:

We also pray for the protection of our minds and hearts. Guard us from fear, anxiety, and self-destructive thoughts. Replace those feelings with Your courage, comfort, and hope. Father, we intercede for those who are grieving, those affected by natural disasters, and those who feel alone in their struggles. Be their refuge, their peace, and their guide.

Finally, Lord, we ask for Your protection over this nation and the world. Heal our divisions, bring peace to our communities, and guide our leaders with wisdom. We trust You to keep us safe and secure in Your loving arms. In Jesus' mighty name, Amen.*

Questions for Reflection:

1. Are there areas in your life where you feel vulnerable or afraid? How can you bring those fears to God in prayer?
 2. In what ways has God shown Himself as your protector in the past?
 3. How can you offer God's peace and protection to someone in your community or family who may be struggling?
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Action Step:

Today, take a moment to pray over your home, room by room, asking for God's protection to fill every corner. If you have children or family members, invite them to join you. Speak Psalm 121 aloud as a declaration of God's covering over your household.

Reminder: God's protection is always present, even when you cannot see it. Lean on His promises and trust that He is watching over your every step.

Day 8: Wisdom and Guidance

Scripture:

"If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you." — James 1:5

Reflection:

Wisdom is more than intelligence; it is God's divine insight that guides our decisions, our relationships, and the way we live. Today's prayer focuses on asking God for wisdom in every area of our lives. Whether it's parenting, navigating careers, making financial choices, or growing relationships, wisdom equips us to act in alignment with God's will.

When Solomon became king, his first request to God wasn't for riches or power, but for wisdom. Why? Because wisdom is the key to discerning the right path, building strong foundations, and making decisions that honor God. In a world filled with distractions, conflicting advice, and uncertainty, wisdom helps us find clarity and peace.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we come before You today, asking for the wisdom You promised to give freely to those who seek it. Lord, guide us in our decisions, both big and small. Teach us how to navigate the complexities of life—our careers, our families, our finances, and our relationships. Grant us discernment to hear Your voice clearly amidst the noise of the world, and give us the courage to act on what You reveal.

Lord, we pray for clarity and the ability to make choices that reflect Your will. We surrender confusion and uncertainty, knowing that You are not the author of chaos but of peace and order. Illuminate our paths and show us the way forward when we feel lost.

We lift up parents who need wisdom in raising their children, couples seeking direction in their marriages, and business owners making pivotal decisions. For those standing at a crossroads, Lord, provide clear guidance and assurance. Give us hearts open to correction and learning, and humble us to seek counsel when needed.

Finally, we ask for peace. As the storms of life rage—whether physical hurricanes or emotional trials—we trust You to guide us to safety and calm our spirits. We pray especially for those affected by the storms in Florida and North Carolina. Lord, protect them, provide for their needs, and send angels to guide and shield them. Let Your wisdom and presence comfort them in their time of need. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. Are there areas in your life where you are seeking clarity? How can you ask God for wisdom in those areas?
 2. What steps can you take to align your decisions with God's word?
 3. Who in your life might benefit from wisdom or guidance today? How can you support them?
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Action Step:

Spend 10 minutes in quiet reflection, asking God for wisdom in a specific area of your life. Write down any thoughts, scriptures, or ideas that come to mind during this time. If you feel led, share your insights with a trusted friend or family member and invite them to pray for clarity with you.

Reminder:

God is generous with His wisdom. The more we seek Him, the more He reveals to us. Trust Him to guide your steps and light your path as you walk through this day.

Day 9: Praying for Relationships and Marriage

Scripture Focus:

"Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."

— Ecclesiastes 4:12

Reflection:

Marriage and relationships are gifts from God, but they come with challenges that often reflect our deepest personal struggles and strengths. God designed marriage to be a refining process—a way for two people to become one while growing closer to Him. A healthy relationship requires intentionality, communication, and forgiveness. It also requires inviting God into the relationship as the third strand of the cord.

As we pray today, we focus on unity, healing, and the strength to weather the storms of life together. Whether you're married, engaged, dating, or praying for future relationships, this is a moment to bring all your desires, hurts, and hopes to God, trusting Him to guide and restore.

Prayer:

Heavenly Father, we thank You for the gift of relationships and the covenant of marriage. Lord, You designed marriage to be a reflection of Your love for us—a union filled with grace, forgiveness, and unity. Today, we lift up every couple, every individual, and every family represented in this prayer. Lord, we ask that You pour out Your spirit of unity and love over them.

We pray for marriages under attack, Lord. We pray for peace in the midst of conflict, for softened hearts where there is bitterness, and for open lines of communication where silence has taken hold. Lord, heal the wounds that have been inflicted by words, actions, or neglect. Bring restoration to broken hearts and remind us that Your love is the ultimate example of forgiveness.

For those on the verge of giving up, Lord, we ask for divine intervention. Show them the beauty of reconciliation and the power of grace. For couples who are struggling with trust, teach them how to rebuild, step by step, leaning on You for wisdom and strength.

Father, we pray for those who are not yet married but desire a godly union. Prepare their hearts and minds, Lord. Help them to grow in You so they can enter into a marriage that glorifies Your name. For those in relationships, we ask for wisdom and discernment. Let their actions and decisions be aligned with Your will.

Lord, teach us to see marriage as a partnership, where both individuals work together to reflect Your love. Give us the courage to forgive as You have forgiven us and to love as

You have loved us. Help us to prioritize prayer in our marriages and relationships, inviting You into every conversation, decision, and challenge.

We lift up extended families, Lord, and pray for peace in those dynamics. Let in-laws and extended relatives be a source of support and not division. We ask for unity across all family relationships, that together we may glorify You.

Lastly, Father, we pray for children who are watching and learning from these relationships. Let them see examples of love, grace, and partnership that point them to You. Strengthen families so that they may be a light in a world that desperately needs Your love. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Questions for Reflection:

1. How can you invite God into your marriage or relationship today?
 2. Are there areas in your relationship where forgiveness is needed?
 3. How can you prioritize communication and prayer in your relationship?
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Action Step:

If you're married or in a relationship, take time today to pray with your partner. It doesn't have to be long or formal—just come together and lift each other up before God. If you're single, spend time praying for your future partner or for the relationships in your life that need healing or strengthening.

Reminder:

A cord of three strands—two people bound together with God—is not easily broken. Keep God at the center of your relationships, and He will guide you through every challenge and celebration.

Day 10: Trusting God in the Storm

Scripture Focus:

"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze."

— Isaiah 43:2

Reflection:

Storms, both literal and figurative, remind us of how little control we truly have. Yet in these moments, we are called to lean into God's sovereignty and His promises. Hurricanes bring destruction and uncertainty, but they also reveal opportunities for community, generosity, and faith.

God's Word assures us that we are not alone. As we pray today, we bring our fears, anxieties, and uncertainties before Him. We seek His protection for those in harm's way and ask for His peace to fill hearts in the midst of chaos. We also pray for clarity to see how we can be His hands and feet, bringing aid and comfort to those in need.

Prayer:

Day 19: The Power of Prayer

Scripture Focus:

Prayer:

Prayer is your greatest weapon, your strongest shield, and your most powerful connection to the God who loves you. Use it boldly and often.

Challenge for Today:

Commit to praying at least three times today: once in the morning, once in the afternoon, and once before bed. Let each prayer be specific, intentional, and heartfelt.

Declaration:

"I am a warrior in prayer. I will seek God boldly, trust Him fully, and watch as He moves powerfully in my life and the lives of those around me."

Day 20: Prayer for Marriage

Scripture Focus:

"Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

— Matthew 19:6

Reflection:

Marriage is one of the most profound relationships God created. It's a union designed to reflect His covenant with us—a partnership of love, commitment, and unity. At its best, marriage is a place where two individuals grow together, sharpen each other, and glorify God through their union.

We pray for wives. Teach them to love with kindness and to support their husbands with wisdom and grace. Help them to create a nurturing home where love, respect, and faith abound. Strengthen their spirits so they can walk confidently in their role as partners and servants of You.

Lord, we pray for unity in marriages. Help couples to communicate effectively, to forgive quickly, and to serve selflessly. Break down walls of bitterness, resentment, and pride.

Challenge for Today:

Day 21: Prayer for Blessings and Favor

Day 22: Prayer for Emotional Healing

Scripture Focus:

Father, we pray for parents and caregivers who are navigating their own emotional wounds while raising children. Grant them the wisdom, strength, and patience to parent from a place of healing rather than hurt. Lord, break the cycle of generational pain and replace it with generational blessings.

Action Step:

Spend time journaling about any emotional wounds or patterns in your life that you feel God is prompting you to address. Be honest and vulnerable, knowing that He sees and loves you through it all. Consider reaching out to a trusted friend, pastor, or therapist to help you navigate this process.

Reminder:

Healing is not always instantaneous, but it is always worth it. God is a patient and gentle Father, taking the time to restore you fully. Trust the process and lean on Him every step of the way.

Challenge for Today:

Choose one scripture that speaks to healing (such as Psalm 147:3 or Isaiah 61:1-3) and meditate on it throughout the day. Speak it over your life and declare God's healing power in your emotions.

Declaration:

"I am not defined by my past wounds, but by the healing power of Jesus Christ. I am whole, I am loved, and I am being restored day by day."

Day 23: Prayer for Endurance

Scripture Focus:

"Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith."

Reflection:

Identify one practical way to build endurance in an area of your life today. Whether it's taking a small step toward a health goal, committing to five more minutes of prayer, or having an honest conversation with a loved one, trust God to meet you in your effort and multiply your strength.

Reminder:

Endurance isn't about perfection; it's about persistence. God sees your effort and honors your faithfulness. Don't focus on the entire race—just take the next step, trusting that He will lead you the rest of the way.

Challenge for Today:

Memorize Hebrews 12:1-2 and speak it over yourself whenever you feel like giving up.

Declare that you will run with endurance, keeping your eyes on Jesus, who has already paved the way for you.

Declaration:

"I am running this race with endurance, trusting that God's strength is my strength. I will not give up, because He is with me, guiding me and sustaining me every step of the way."

Day 24: Prayer for Holiness

Scripture Focus:

"But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy.'"

— 1 Peter 1:15-16

Reflection:

Day 25: Prayer for Victims and Justice

Scripture Focus:

*"The Lord works righteousness and justice for all the oppressed."

Reflection:
